Back by popular demand!! Lieutenant Colonel (R) **Tom Di Tomasso**, returns to present his cutting-edge seminar on *Leadership Practices, Crisis Planning and Decision Making*. This seminar offers an excellent opportunity for new and seasoned leaders to evaluate their own leadership practices and learn new techniques. He will also expand on crisis planning and decision making; culminating with a practical exercise utilizing ICS to resolve a crisis.

This seminar will cover concrete leadership principles which have been "battle" tested. No matter what your occupation, if you lead people or may be in charge of people during a stressful event, this seminar is for you. LTC Di Tomasso will use extreme vignettes and draw upon lessons learned from his personal experience as a leader in the Battle of Mogadishu (depicted in the book and movie Blackhawk Down).

On October 3, 1993, Task Force Ranger launched an operation in Mogadishu, Somalia aimed at capturing key members of the Somali National Alliance. During the course of the operation, two U.S. helicopters were shot down igniting an eighteen-hour firefight that would leave eighteen Americans and hundreds of Somalis dead. The tactical success of Task Force Ranger against a numerically superior enemy can be attributed to their initiative, training, endurance, valor and leadership. Although a strategic failure, the tactical and leadership lessons learned from the Battle of the Black Sea continue to serve us well. As a participant and leader in the Battle of Mogadishu, Lieutenant Colonel Tom Di Tomasso will describe leadership lessons useful to current and future leaders of any organization. He describes what it takes to lead men in combat - the greatest responsibility anyone can have - and how that leadership model can be used in any organization.

LTC (R) Tom Di Tomasso presents this seminar based on enduring leadership lessons learned from more than 20 years of military service and combat deployments. LTC Di Tomasso recently served as a Joint Task Force Commander in Iraq responsible for more than twelve hundred special operations forces and government agency personnel. He is currently VP of Fulcrum Concepts, a veteran-owned company comprised of seasoned professionals providing leadership development training and operational consulting to National Law Enforcement/First Responders, corporate and military agencies.
